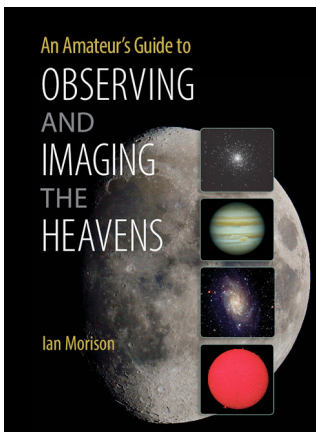
The Hidden Jane Austen
